Public Safety Report November, 2018

Statistical Highlights

During the month of November, there were eight reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with 15 for the month of October and eight during the month of November last year. Officers made three in-custody or field release arrests in November – one for Warrants, one for Theft and one for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Officers responded to 18 Traffic Crashes, compared to 23 for October, and this resulted in two crash reports being created. Both crashes this month occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In November, our officers made 133 traffic stops, issuing 79 citations (59.4%) resulting in 83 violations, and 90 warnings (67.6%). Of the violations that were cited, 61 (73.5%) were for speeding, including 12 for speeding in a school zone. Officers also wrote two citations for Failing to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 9 violations and 18 warnings.

During November, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 231 calls for service, compared to 234 calls for service in October. During the month, 41 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 123 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 137 for October.

Investigations

In November, Detective Torres was assigned 13 new cases. Of these 13 cases, two were closed or suspended in November – eleven are carrying over into December. Detective Torres currently has 14 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 94 hours of training, including classes in “FBI-LEEDA Supervisory Leadership”, “Family Violence Investigation”, and multiple courses in “IT Security”.
